### Maryland Launches Longevity Ready Initiative: Planning for Maryland's Growing Older Population

The Division of Geriatric Medicine and Gerontology at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center welcome **Maryland Department of Aging Secretary Carmel Roques** as presenter for this year's lecture. She was appointed to this role by Governor Wes Moore in 2023.

In January 2024, the governor signed an executive order establishing the Longevity Ready Maryland Initiative and directed the Maryland Department of Aging to develop a long-term plan to address the needs of the growing older population and the infrastructure that supports them. Speaking about these goals, Secretary Roques said:

"Integrating a longevity lens into every government department, promoting coordinated responses, and helping the state shape how public services are delivered will help us prepare, serve and utilize our aging population."
